Module Aims

This module aims to allow students to research in detail a particular area of economic theory, practice or policy and to develop investigative skills and the ability to write a dissertation.

Outline Syllabus

Students choose a topic for their dissertation. Any area of economic theory, practice or policy can be chosen, provided it's approved by a supervisor. The supervisor will guide their independent work.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

Students will be allocated a supervisor at the beginning of the year and provided with a handbook to guide them through the dissertation process. Throughout the year students will have a series of meetings with their supervisor as they develop their project. A 3500-word research outline comprising overview, economic theory and empirical/contextual literature review chapters is due at the end of Semester 1. In Semester 2 this will be extended to include methodology, analysis/results and conclusion chapters for an 8000-word dissertation.
