Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
<p>The module components will be introduced by lectures, including sessions run by the careers service involving outside and employer speakers. The main learning activity consists of in-class exercises in tutorials and workshops. These exercises and your preparation for them will focus on the different elements of the syllabus and you will learn by doing, researching careers and legal issues (LOs1, 2), presenting findings (LOs 1,3), drafting legal advice letters (LO 3), confronting ethical dilemmas (LO 4) and advocacy exercises (LOs 2,3). All teaching and learning is supported by information (including the module handbook) provided on Canvas, our virtual learning environment.</p> <p>The module is designed to provide formative assessment with feedback through practice exercises in class. These lead into the two summative assessment tasks that test the five learning outcomes as indicated below.</p> <p>The assessment focus is on the progressive development, through practice and reflection, of the competencies and skills comprised in the learning outcomes.</p>
