Module Aims
The module aims to develop knowledge, understanding, and application of therapeutic approaches and interventions, in relation to the field of Mental Health Nursing. This will aid you to meet the health care needs of individuals and their families / carers using a biopsychosocial approach.

Outline Syllabus

Critique the values held by mental health nurses, which inform the development of a therapeutic relationship.

Articulate and critique the pre engagement, engagement, therapeutic alliance, collaboration, transition and endings within the therapeutic relationship.

Evaluate boosters and barriers to therapeutic engagement.

Evaluate the nature of collaborative therapeutic relationships.

Critically evaluate the biopsychosocial model in relation to delivering therapeutic interventions for mental health conditions.

Apply case formulation within the context of the bio psychosocial model.

Critique the application of therapeutic risk assessment and risk management within therapeutic approaches.

Examine crisis intervention within the delivery of therapeutic approaches.

Discuss the nature of therapeutic one to one, group and family interventions within mental health care settings.

Examine multi agency working within mental health clinical settings.

Discuss and evaluate the Application of Mental Health legislation in relation to therapeutic approaches and critique ethical implications within this.

Evaluate the input of statutory and non-statutory provision for the delivery of therapeutic approaches, inclusive of service user led developments and inter professional working.

Evaluate the use of pharmacological approaches to enhance mental well-being to enable the delivery of therapeutic approaches on a one to one or group basis.

Evaluate the use of technology in the delivery of therapeutic approaches. Apply research to practice in respect of therapeutic approaches.
