

University Regulations: Regulation 26

Membership of the Council, the Senate and the Faculty Boards

1 THE COUNCIL

- **1.1** The periods of office of appointed and co-opted members shall expire on 31 July.
- **1.2** The procedures for the appointment and co-option of members shall normally be completed during the four months preceding the commencement of the period of office.
- **1.3** A retiring member shall be eligible for re-appointment or a further period of co-option.

2 THE SENATE

- **2.1** The periods of office of appointed and elected members shall expire on 31 July.
- **2.2** The procedures for the appointment or election of members shall normally be completed during the four months preceding the commencement of the period of office, always provided that this shall not preclude the election at any time by the Assembly of further members consequent upon an addition to the appointed membership.
- **2.3** A retiring member shall be eligible for re-appointment or re-election.

3 THE FACULTY BOARDS

- 3.1 The periods of office of appointed and elected members shall expire on 31 July.
- **3.2** The procedures for the appointment or election of members shall normally be completed during the four months preceding the commencement of the period of office, always provided that this shall not preclude the election at any time by and from all the members of the academic staff of the Faculty (other than the ex-officio members of the Faculty Board) of further members consequent upon an addition to the ex-officio membership of the Faculty Board.
- **3.3** A retiring member shall be eligible for re-appointment or re-election.

Footnote:

The University's Charter and Statutes provide for the governance of the University to be carried out by a number of persons and bodies, including the Senate and the Statutory Departments. The Statutes require these Departments to be grouped into Faculties, each having a Faculty Board. The Senate has resolved to change this method of governance, replacing the Faculties and Departments with academic Schools.

Pending changes to the Statutes which will require the approval of the Privy Council, transitional arrangements will apply which involve the delegation of the functions and powers of the Statutory Bodies to new bodies. Under these transitional arrangements, section (3) of the above Regulation is obsolete, the responsibilities of the **Faculty Boards** having been delegated to the **School Boards**.
